






Faculty of Chemistry

Chemist, specialising in environmental research. He was a representative of the Republic of Poland in the Joint Programming Research team of the European Union (2010-2012), and currently holds positions in scientific and expert bodies - among others: Vice-Chairman of the Committee of Analytical Chemistry of the Polish Academy of Sciences, Vice-President of the Division Green Chemistry EuCheMS, correspondence member of the Polish Academy of Sciences, the Polish Chemical Society and the Society of Environmental Toxicology and Awards Panel of the Minister of Science and Higher Education. As Rector, he directs the University's activities and represents it externally

Faculty of Law and Administration

Lawyer, specialist in financial law, in particular financial market security issues in the area of private as well as public law. She has served as an expert for the European Commission, the Financial Supervision Commission and the Financial Ombudsman. As Vice-Rector, she is responsible for initiating, monitoring and advising on scientific and project-based international cooperation.

Faculty of Mathematics, Physics and Informatics





Theoretical physicist, specialist in issues related to quantum mechanics, in particular quantum entanglement theory. Managed numerous research projects of the National Science Centre (programmes: Sonata Bis, Harmonia) and the Foundation for Polish Science (Columbus programme), as well as an international project in a joint programme of the National Science Centre and the Deutsche Forschungsgemeinschaft (Beethoven). Since 2020, he chairs the Council of the National Centre for Quantum Informatics.

As Vice-Rector, he is responsible for the coordination and supervision of research work, including the maintenance and development of faculty research potential within the various scientific disciplines and the implementation of research projects.

Faculty of History

Historian, specialising in Swedish history in the 20th century, Polish-Swedish relations and the history of the Polish community in Scandinavia in the 20th century, as well as Polish and Scandinavian didactics of history and social studies. Member of many organisations and councils related to teaching and research activities, e.g.: Polish-Scandinavian Institute (Copenhagen), Baltic Institute, Kashubian Institute. As Vice-Rector, he is responsible for matters concerning students and doctoral students of the University of Gdańsk and for matters of education in degree programmes, postgraduate programmes and courses and training provided at the University's organisational units.

Faculty of Social Sciences

Political scientist with research interests in European integration, political theory, public participation (especially participatory technology assessment) and energy policy. Organised and led as Director of the Centre for Sustainable Development at the University of Gdańsk.

As Vice-Rector, she is responsible for matters relating to the implementation of the adopted and initiating new directions of development of the University and supporting the commercialisation of research results of the University of Gdańsk.






ORGANISATIONAL STRUCTURE OF THE UNIVERSITY OF GDAŃSK
