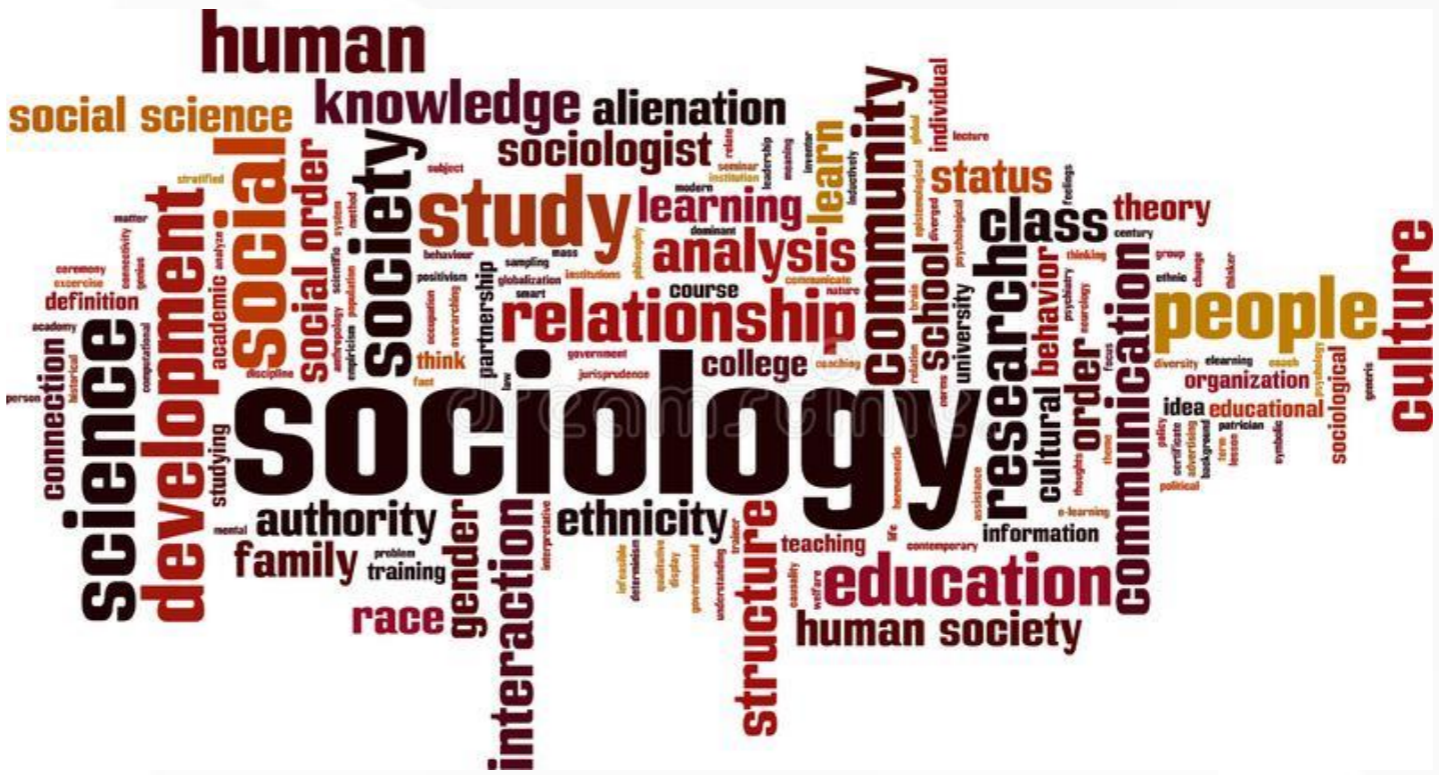

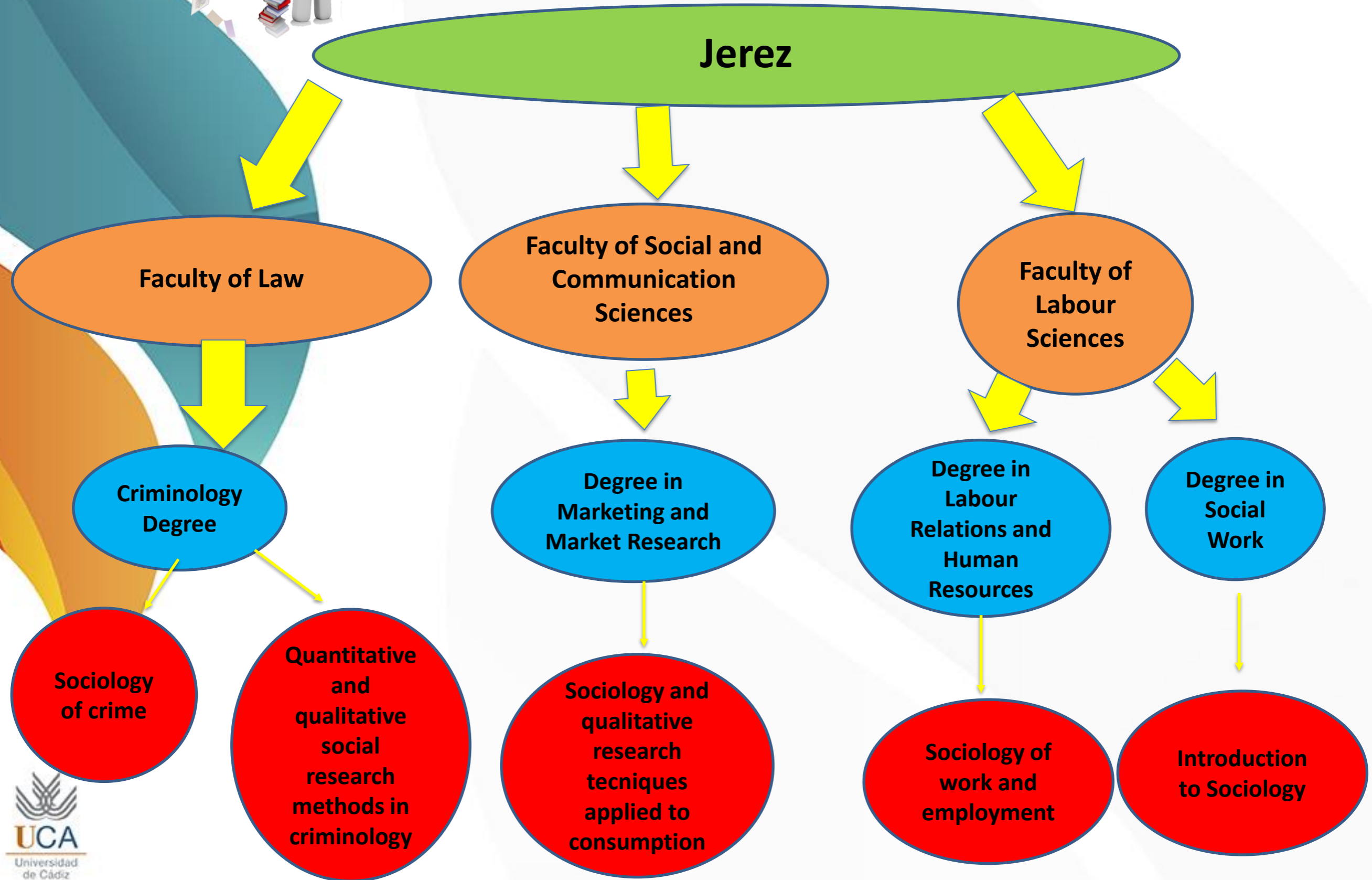
# SOCIOLOGIST?

# TEACHING SOCIOLOGY



- There is **not a Specific Degree** in Sociology.
- Academic Staff: **25 people** (10 men, 15 women) members of Sociology Area, at the Department of General Economy, each of us specialized in different fields of sociology.

- Sociology as **specific methodology** to understand social actors, values, cultures, institutions, organizations and political processes in each society and in a **gendered, diverse and globalized world**.

**Translation: Social changes and conflicts in contemporary societies**

**Main areas of research are:**

- Well-being, care and social intervention.
- Democracy, participation and social movement.
- Heritage, culture and new consumption patterns.
- Socio-spatial relations, new rurality and conflict.
- Work, (im)mobilities and gender.

# *INTERNATIONAL NETWORK RESEARCH*

## **Main areas of research are:**

- Work, labor and employment.
- Reconciliation and **co-responsibility** of work, family and personal life.
- Gender inequalities in employment and time use.
- Gender-based violence.
- Gender pay gap.
- Gender equality policies.



# *Opportunities, challenges, new research questions from a sociological perspective*

- 1) How to Integrate **sociology into the curricula** of a greater number of undergraduate and postgraduate degrees.
- 2) How to increase the participation of sociology in **interdisciplinary teams** that address lines and interests of research with **multi-causal and multi-level explanations**.
- 3) How to include **gender and intersectional perspective** in the analysis of the universities, in terms of teaching, research and management.



# *Forthcoming International Research Projects*

- 1) **Feminist urbanism:** introducing a gender perspective in the design and implementation of urban policies: What are governments doing to build women-friendly cities?
- 2) **Resistance and counter-resistance to equality** within organisations (political, educational and judiciary institutions).
- 3) **Advances and setbacks in equality** as a consequence of the **rise of populist radical right parties** in contemporary societies. (PRRPs)
