| Accommodation recommendations | Nesna, Norway. Accommodation in self-catering apartments at <u>Demmabakken</u> student home, Nesna (studentinord.no) Bedsits with shared bathroom/kitchen are reserved for the participants. Accommodation costs must be covered by the student: approx. 1430 NOK/week. |

| The physical mobility will take place at | Nord university, Campus Nesna, Norway. Parts of the on-site component will take place during transportation on the Norwegian coastal express Hurtigruten (free of cost). Participants need to book their own transportation into the city of Trondheim and out of the city of Bodø (covered by own Erasmus + funding). Both cities have airports with connections to Oslo and further to international airports. Recommendations for travel to and from Norway: - arrival in Trondheim April 21st 2024 - departure from Bodø in the afternoon/evening of April 26th 2024. Possible accommodation in Trondheim from 21st April – 22nd April must be paid by the participant through Erasmus+ funding.
